Texas Registered & Licensed Child Care Homes - Annual Training - Primary Caregivers

General Clock Hour Requirements:

The State of TEXAS requires primary caregivers to obtain at least <u>30 clock-hours</u> of training each year. These include:

- 1.) 80% (24 Hours) MAY be obtained from self-instructional sources (such as online training currently offered through Impact Training Center).
- 2.) 20% (6 hours) MUST be obtained from interactive sources (ie. Face to face class, webinar, or similiar)

PLEASE NOTE: The above annual training clock hours DO NOT INCLUDE any requirements for: orientation, pre-service training, CPR and first aid training, transportation safety training, and high school child-care work-study classes.

A Primary Caregiver with five or fewer years of experience as a primary caregiver in a licensed or registered child care home, must complete at least 6 hours of annual training in management techniques, leadership, or staff supervision. A Primary Caregiver with more than 5 years experience must complete 3 hours of annual training in these area's -
